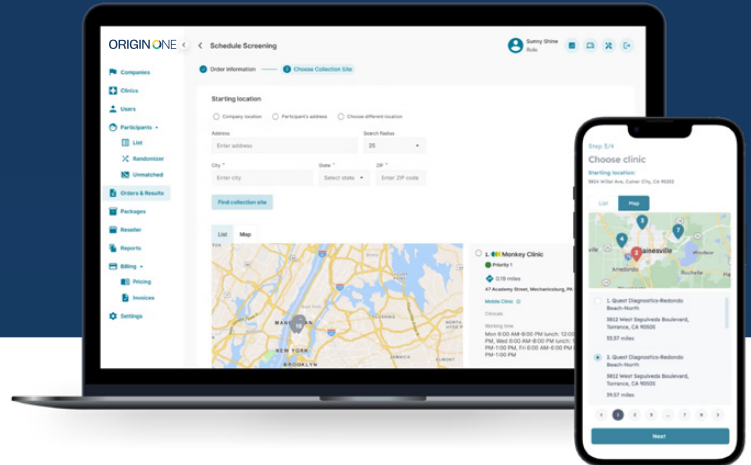

3. Do you support a fully electronic chain of custody?

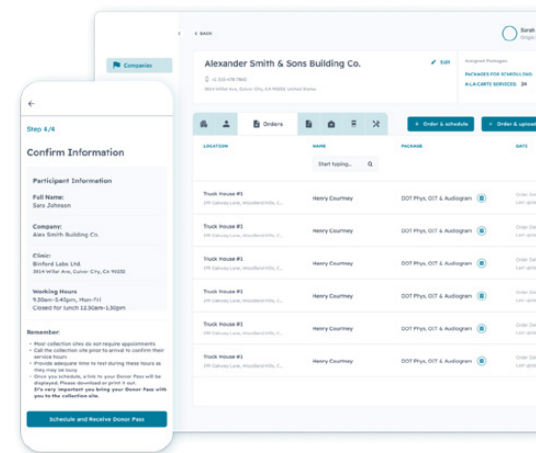
The software should provide true electronic chain of custody, not partial digitization. This is especially important for DOT compliance.
